November 5, 2023: Thirty-first Sunday, Ordinary Time The call to service

The tension between Jesus the Scribes and the Pharisees increased when Jesus said to the crowds that those who would be great must be servants of each other. Jesus based His teachings on the same laws and traditions available to the Pharisees, but although both interpreted the Law of Moses for contemporary Jewish life, the difference was that Jesus spoke to rescue the Law, and for all times. The Lord entrusted them, and were influential in determining the Jewish practice, but Jesus warned the crowds not to follow their example, saying, "The Scribes and the Pharisees have taken their seat on the chair of Moses, therefore, do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. They preach but do not practise. They tie up heavy burdens that are hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them. All their works are performed to be seen. They widen their phylacteries and lengthen their tassels. They love places of honour at banquets, seats of honour in synagogues, greetings in marketplaces, and to be called 'Rabbi' (Teacher). But you have one Teacher, and you are all brothers. You have but one Father in heaven, and one master, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted." (cf. Mt 23: 1-12) Yet an active internal debate grew within the new believers, for they thought that a break with the synagogue wasn't necessary to follow Jesus. In any case, Jesus approved what the Scribes and Pharisees taught, but their behaviour was to be avoided, namely, their love of being honoured and exalted. Jesus referred to the phylacteries, which were small boxes containing Scripture verses that were placed on their left forearm and forehead, and the tassels, which were fringes worn on the corners of a person's garments to remind the user to keep the commandments. The warning of Jesus against the works performed to be seen, and to be honoured, was not only addressed for the Scribes and the Teachers of the Law, but it resonates with us in our days. So, the Christian leadership is a call to serve for the glory of God, and a call to be a servant of all like Jesus.
