### Reading Reflection From One of our Own

The Wise and the Foolish Virgins. --- (by: Agustin G.)

Jesus said in a parable that the Kingdom of Heaven can be compared to ten virgins who went forth to meet the bridegroom. We know from the researchers of the past, that it was the custom for young maidens—friends and family members of the bride—to meet the bridegroom when he came to bring his bride to her new home. Of the ten, five, wisely, took enough oil to keep their lamps lit; and five, foolishly, neglected the oil. Since the bridegroom was long delayed, the maids became drowsy and fell asleep. At midnight, there was a cry, "Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!" Then the maids got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish ones said to the wise, "Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out." But the wise ones replied, "No, for there may not be enough for us and you. Go instead to the merchants and buy some for yourselves." While they went off to buy it, the bridegroom came and only those who were ready went with him inside to the Wedding Feast. Then the doors were locked. Afterwards the foolish came and said, "Lord, Lord, open the door for us!" But he replied, "Amen, I say to you, I do not know you." It seems that Jesus is mentioning two events in this parable, one is the coming of Jesus in the Eucharistic Wedding Feast for those who are ready, which is missed by the foolish virgins, and the second is His coming in the final judgment, of which Jesus said, "stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour." (cf. Mt 25: 1-13) "I am the light of the world," said Jesus, "those who walk with me shall not walk in darkness but shall have the light of life." (cf. Jn 8: 12) The virgins, who were prepared with the oil of the Holy Spirit, illuminated their way to meet Jesus returning at the end of times. The foolish virgins were the Jewish leaders, who didn't have their lamps lit with the Holy Spirit to meet Jesus the Messiah, the bridegroom of Israel. Christians, for their part, shouldn't follow their example but remain vigilant, because Jesus, the bridegroom, will notice the lack of the Holy Spirit in the foolish who approach Him.
