Reading Reflection From One of our Own The gifts of God. --- (by: Agustin G.)

God has given us gifts in this life to serve God and to one another in accordance with our abilities. And the judgment of God, at the end of our lives, will be based on the response we render in the Kingdom of Heaven that comes with Jesus. Jesus told us in a parable that before leaving on a journey, a master entrusted to his servants with a different number of talents. A talent is a coin of great value. To one he gave five talents; to another, two; to another, one; then he went away. Immediately the one who received five talents went and traded with them and made another five talents. Likewise, the one who received two, who made another two. But the man who received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and buried his master's money. When the master returned, he found that the first and the second servants had doubled his money, and both were rewarded. His master said to them, "Well done, my good and faithful servants. Come, share your master's joy." He even entrusted them with higher positions. The one who received one talent, however, came and said, "Master, I knew you were a demanding person, harvesting where you did not plant and gathering where you did not scatter; so out of fear I went off and buried your talent in the ground. Here it is back." Then the master said to him in reply, "You wicked, lazy servant! So, you knew that I harvest where I do not plant and gather where I do not scatter? Should you not then have put my money in the bank so that I could have got it back with interest on my return?" Then he said to his soldiers, "Take the talent from him and give it to the one with ten. For everyone who has, more will be given; but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. And throw this useless servant where there will be the wailing and the grinding of teeth." (cf. Mt 25: 14-30) To use well the gifts that God gives us, prayer and discernment ought to lead us, and the grace of God will allow us to succeed in the work of serving God and neighbor in the Kingdom of Heaven.
