Stewardship Reflection

In today's second reading Paul concludes his letter to the Christian community at Thessalonica by providing it with actions to take as its members wait for the return of the Lord. The first action is to rejoice always and give thanks in all circumstances. This sounds easy but it's not. The two words that make this task difficult are "always" and "all". This means giving thanks and rejoicing even when our circumstances are not always moments of joy and thanksgiving, or when we are confronted with a broken world. Prayerful stewards rejoice and give thanks in all circumstances because they are people of hope. A good reflection this week would be how the season of Advent can give you reason to hope.

Reading Reflection From One of our Own John the Baptist. --- (by: Agustin G.)

The Gospel of St. John places the existence of Jesus with God since the beginning of time. He calls Him "the light that is coming into the darkness of the world." And the Gospel of St. Mark is clear, in that John the Baptist's role is only to prepare the way for Jesus, who is the one who will come. God speaks to His Son through the prophet Isaias, saying: "Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way. A voice of one crying out in the desert: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight His paths." So, when the Levites and the Pharisees question John the Baptist about his identity and the meaning of his baptism, he tells them that he is not the Messiah, nor is he Elias or the Prophet, that he is only preaching and baptizing to prepare for the coming of another who would bring salvation to humanity baptizing with the Holy Spirit. John proclaimed in the desert a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, and the inhabitants of the area went to him to be baptized in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. He proclaimed to them: "After me is coming one who is mightier than I. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of His sandals. I have baptized you with water; He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." (cf. Mk 1: 1-8) He told them that he is only baptizing with water, but that the one who is coming will baptize them also with the Holy Spirit. He also tells them that the Messiah they seek is already among them, the savior promised by God. "I am only the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord,' as Isaiah said. "I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." (cf. Jn 1: 6-8, 19-28) The baptism of John the Baptist was only a preparation for the Baptism of Jesus, a Sacrament through which our sins are forgiven, mainly the Original Sin. This allows us to receive the Grace, which is the gift of the Holy Spirit.
