
Parish 75th Anniversary

Reading Reflection From One of our Own The wise men from the East. --- (by: Aqustin G.)

This royal celebration we call Epiphany, which means "manifestation," and the gifts that some wise men brought are a foreshadowing of the role of Jesus in the salvation of mankind. We know very little about the wise men, also called Magi, who came to pay homage to Jesus as He was born. All we know is that they came from the East and journeyed to Bethlehem, following an astrological sign. By this we believe that they were astrologers and assume that were three in number based upon their three gifts. For sure they had already by the Holy Spirit the knowledge about the Messiah and had become acquainted with the old Prophecies of the Jewish people. They brought gold to honor the kingship of Jesus, frankincense which was a symbol of His divinity because Priests burned the substance in the Temple. And the Myrrh, which they offered in anticipation of His death. When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, these wise men from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw His star at its rising and have come to do Him homage." King Herod was frightened and assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: 'And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means the least, since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel."" Then Herod secretly called the magi and told them, "Go to Bethlehem and search diligently for the child, and when you have found Him, bring me word, that I too may go and do Him homage." They set out, and behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary His mother. They prostrated themselves and did Him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered Him gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their countries another way. (cf.
