Reading Reflection From One of our Own

The Lamb of God. --- (by: Agustin G.)

The Church celebrates now the Baptism of the Lord. In this event, John the Baptist gives testimony that Jesus is the Lamb of God, a title that recalled to the people key themes from the Old Testament, like the paschal lamb offered as a sacrifice to God when the Israelites were freed from the slavery in Egypt. He also mentions the prophet Isaias who calls Jesus the suffering servant of Israel, a name that predicts the Passover, which is His passion and death (cf. Jn 1: 35-42) After the Baptism, as Jesus was walking away, the Baptist pointed to Him saying, "Behold, the Lamb of God," which prompted Andrew and John, two of his disciples, to follow Jesus. In the Baptism of Jesus, they must have witnessed the descend of the Holy Spirit as dove and must have heard the voice of God claiming that Jesus was His beloved Son, in whom He was well pleased. So, after hearing the testimony of the Baptist, they became followers of Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following Him, said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to Him, "Rabbi," which translated means Teacher, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and see." So, they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with Him that day. They came to believe that Jesus was the Messiah, and although the Baptist identified Jesus as the Lamb of God, using the framework of the Old Testament, still they were not prepared to look in the Messiah the suffering Son of God being sacrificed for our sins. The details of their time with Jesus that day are not specified, but later, Andrew brought his brother Simon saying to him, "We have found the Messiah," which is translated Christ. And Jesus looked at Simon and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas," which is translated Peter or Rock, and is the name given to God in the Old Testament (cf. Dt 32: 4) Peter means "rock" in Greek. We see here an example of the usual pattern for the rabbinical schools of the time. Jews sought out rabbis and established themselves as disciples of a particular rabbi. Later, Phillips brought Nathaniel to join the group, and some others followed.
