Reading Reflection From One of our Own

A man with an unclean spirit. --- (by: Agustin G.) The Gospel of St. Mark tells us about a turical d

The Gospel of St. Mark tells us about a typical day in the public ministry of Jesus. He and His followers arrived at a small village near the Sea of Galilee called Capernaum and, on the Sabbath, they went to the synagogue to pray. Jesus also taught to the people, who responded to His teaching with astonishment, noticing that He taught with authority, which contrasted with that of the Scribes. They also noticed the tension growing between Him and the Scribes and Pharisees, which would eventually increase until they will put Him to death. That day in the synagogue an astonishing thing happened. There was a man with an unclean spirit, who interrupted the teaching of Jesus, screaming out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are-the Holy One of God!" Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit and saying, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed the man and came out of him with a loud cry. All the presents were petrified and asked each other, "What is this? A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey Him." So, Jesus' fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee (cf. Mk 1: 21-28) And as we will read in the Scriptures, frequently will order the unclean spirits and demons to Jesus be quiet, as He did this time, and get out of the possessed. The ability of Jesus to heal those possessed by demons was an indication for many of His power over evil proper of God. And although all illnesses in the time of Jesus were understood to be manifestations of evil and sinfulness, our understanding of illnesses and infirmities is different in our times. And we can interpret that the possession by unclean spirits may have been mental illness or other physical condition. Also, there were many kinds of exorcists and healers in the time of Jesus, but Jesus healed with unique authority, connecting His healing actions with the words of His preaching. This time, the crowds saw in the cure of the possessed man, affirmation of the authority of Jesus, which gave greater credence to His teaching. He impressed them, not only through words but by the deeds of an exceptional individual.
