Reading Reflection From One of our Own

You are dust and to dust you shall return." --- (by: Aqustin G.)

This Liturgical sign, performed by the Church on Ash Wednesday, represent the summary of our Christian life. It is expressed in the tracing with ashes of a cross on our foreheads, reminding us of our origin and our end in this life. When we receive the ashes, these words are said: "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." This sign of the ashes is at the same time the sign of the victory that Jesus won for us over death, which we as Christians will receive through our faithfulness to Him. He won this resounding victory in His death and resurrection. The Gospel tells us that immediately after His Baptism, Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert where He was tempted by the devil for 40 days (cf. Mk 1: 12-15) This event recalls us of the 40 years spent by the Israelites, wandering toward freedom in the desert, after their slavery in Egypt. In this season of Lenten, the Church remembers the significance of these events, setting aside 40 days to meditate about the battle that Jesus, quoting the Scriptures, won over Satan in the desert for us. Jesus resisted the temptations of Satan, even in His final hours on the cross. The Lenten season starts with the Ash Wednesday, when the Church calls us to a change of heart as a preparation to celebrate Easter, the highest point of our Christian life. We renew our commitment to the traditional practices of prayer, almsgiving and fasting, as part of our Christian life and are to be done in private as Jesus taught us in the Sermon of the Mount (cf. Mt 6: 1 -18) Jesus warned His followers not to act for the sake of appearance when giving alms, praying and fasting, but to do them for God, who sees the heart and knows what is hidden. These Lenten observances are only the beginning and should continue the rest of our lives, following the example of Jesus in our resistance to the temptations of the devil. And we must know that we are led by the Holy Spirit in the Kingdom of God, who reminds us of the vows of our Baptism, in which we promised to reject sin and obediently embrace Jesus our savior.
