

Reading Reflection From One of our Own

The Transfiguration of Jesus --- (by: Agustin G.)

The disciples of Jesus became confused, when the disciple Peter confessed that Jesus was the Messiah and Jesus predicted His own death and resurrection. They were expecting a conqueror type like David and didn't understand His death and resurrection. So, Jesus took Peter, James, and John to a high mountain to reassure them. In there, the clothes of Jesus became dazzling white, and Elias and Moses appeared conversing with Jesus. According to the Gospel of Luke, the conversation was about what Jesus would accomplish in Jerusalem in His mission to redeem humanity. Elias and Moses are significant figures in the history of Israel: Elias, important prophet of Israel, who helped the Israelites to stay faithful to God. Some Jews even believed that the return of Elias would signal the coming of the Messiah. And Moses, who led the Israelites from the slavery in Egypt to the freedom in the desert, where he received from God the Ten Commandments that guided the lives of the Jewish people. The appearance of these two important figures with Jesus in the history of Israel signifies the continuity of Jesus with the Law and with the prophets, and that Jesus was the fulfillment of all the promises of God to the people of Israel. The Transfiguration of Jesus was necessary to dispel the doubts of the followers of Jesus but what they witnessed terrified them. Peter hardly knew what he was saying in his excitement and offered the construction of three tents for them. In the middle of the confusion of the disciples, a voice from heaven was heard, saying, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." This voice from heaven not only confirmed that Jesus was the Son of God but commanded us to obey Him. It recalled the voice heard at the Baptism of Jesus. When their spell was over the disciples, looking around, didn't see the Prophets but only Jesus alone with them. In this Transfiguration, we see an anticipation of the glory of the Resurrection of Jesus, which the disciples hardly saw and understood but only after witnessing His death and Resurrection. And, as they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone, until the Son of Man had risen from the dead (cf. Mk 9: 2-10)
