

Reading Reflection From One of our Own

What Jesus said to Nicodemus. --- (by: Agustin G.)

Nicodemus was a Pharisee who acknowledged that Jesus had come from God and wanted to know more about Him and the meaning of His sayings. Among the things that Jesus had said was that "One must be born again." Nicodemus, however, misunderstood the meaning of "born again," and Jesus patiently explained to him that "One must be born from above to see the Kingdom of God." That "Except one be born of water and of the Spirit, one cannot enter the kingdom of God. For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life. God did not send His Son into the world to condemn it, but that the world might be saved through Him." And Jesus compared His case with an incident in the Old Testament, when the Israelites criticized the Lord during their sojourn in the desert in which God allowed venomous serpents to attack them. The Israelites repented and asked Moses to pray for them and the Lord heard the prayer. He instructed Moses to make a bronze serpent and mount it on a pole; and all who had been bitten by a serpent and then looked upon the bronze serpent were healed. Jesus connected this incident with the salvation that He would accomplish through His death and Resurrection. He said that "Just as Moses lifted the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in Him may have eternal life. Whoever believes in Him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God." The Gospel also applies to Jesus, the concepts of light and darkness and belief, and unbelief, good and evil, salvation and condemnation. It says that Jesus came into the world to reveal our sins so that they may be forgiven, but the people preferred darkness to light because their works were evil and they didn't want exposed, (cf. Jn 3: 5-21) The Gospel concludes by saying that those who do the good things according to the truth of Jesus are not shy in coming to light because they recognize that they belong to God.
