Reading Reflection From One of our Own

Everyone will be drawn to Jesus. --- (by: Agustin G.)

The Gospel of St. John says that many people gathered where Jesus went, not only to see Him, but because they knew that Jesus had just raised Lazarus from the dead, if possible, to see Lazarus too. Even some Greeks, who had come to Jerusalem to worship at the Passover Feast, expressed to some of the disciples their interest in seeing Jesus. All this frightened the Sanhedrin of the Jewish authorities, that was already planning to kill Him; so, He openly addressed to the crowd, saying "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me. I am troubled now. Yet, what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice thundered from heaven, saying, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again." Some in the crowd said that an angel had spoken to Him, but Jesus said, "This voice did not come for my sake but for yours. Now is the time of judgment on this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself." (cf. Jn 12: 20-33) The voice heard from heaven was like the one heard at Jesus' baptism and at Jesus' Transfiguration, confirming that God welcomed the sacrifice that Jesus would make on behalf of humanity. Jesus was openly predicted His own suffering, death, and Resurrection, and was preparing His disciples for the salvation that His death and resurrection would accomplish through them. In His suffering and death Jesus would obtain the forgiveness of our sins, satisfying the Justice of God, and through His Resurrection He would conquer Satan, the ruler of this world. Now, the world would be judged, not in condemnation but in salvation.
