Reading Reflection From One of our Own **Palm Sunday.** --- (by: Agustin G.)

The passion and the death of Jesus is seeing by the Gospel of St. Mark as the consequence of the tension between Jesus and the Jewish authorities. This tension grew throughout His public mission life and reached its breaking point when He drove the merchants and moneychangers from the Temple. After that incident, the chief priests and scribes began to actively seek a way to put Jesus to death; but the presence of big crowds following Jesus refrained them. However, they saw an opportunity in the festival of Jerusalem approaching, and Jesus attending. In His way, Jesus said to His disciples to go to a certain place and take a colt of a donkey there, saying to the owner: "The Lord needs it, and will send it back to you." Then putting their cloaks on it brought it to Jesus, who sat on it. Jesus was complying with the old prophecy about Him entering the city riding a colt of a young donkey. In fact, it is written: "Do not be afraid, daughter Zion. Look, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" and many people had already congregated at the entrance of the city to meet Him. Many of them admired His miracles of other places, and hearing that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem for the festival, enthusiastically took branches of palm trees and throwing their cloaks on the road in front of Jesus, shouted, "!Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!" Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" (cf. Mk 15: 1-39) They, as some of the disciples, didn't understand completely these events in the spiritual sense, and saw in the coming of Jesus a defiance to the Jewish authorities, and as fight like those of the conqueror king David. It was only after His crucifixion and death, when God glorified Jesus in His Resurrection, that they understood that those things had already been written of Him to comply with God's plans. It was out of love that God had sent Jesus in peace, as the meek sacrificial lamb of God to be offered in expiation to the justice of God, so that the sins of humanity could obtain forgiveness. Moreover, that God had sent the Eucharistic Jesus to give us eternal life.
